We welcome your suggestions and participation at our monthly board meetings, held the first Monday of each month at the LITH Village Hall. INTRODUCTION TO CHEERLEADING SQUADS:

We have two different levels or types of cheerleading squads to accommodate your family's schedule and commitment.

COMPETITIVE SQUADS:

These squads are competitive and will cheer for the L.A. Jr. Eagles Football teams. They will also participate in at least four cheer competitions. Their season begins in July and will end in late November.* The practice schedule will begin at 3 days a week to learn the cheers and halftime routines. When school begins, they will continue to practice 3 days a week to prepare for the competitions. *Mandatory attendance* is expected for these squads. A strong commitment is necessary for the success of the team. These squads will generally cheer on Sundays. **Please refer to your Competitive Cheer Program form signed at registration*.

** If the squad qualifies for the State Competition, the entire squad will be expected to practice through and participate in the State Competition, which will be held in early December.

Please Note: Cheerleaders on the Competition Squads will be required to compete in 4 competitions during the season. Competitions come first, regardless of pre scheduled games, playoff games and/or events.

RECREATIONAL (NON COMPETITIVE) SQUADS:

These squads are strictly recreational and will cheer for the L.A. Jr. Eagles Football teams. They do not participate in competitions. Their season begins July and will end in November. Their practice schedule will begin at 3 days a week to learn the cheers and halftime routines. Coaches of each squad may adjust the schedule to accommodate the individual squads needs. When school starts, Rec. squad practices will drop to one day a week with the location and times TBA. Generally, these squads will cheer on Saturdays.

CHEERS AND CHANTS:

The words to most of our chants and cheers will be available on our website. We encourage you to print a copy for your cheerleader to reference when he/she is at home practicing. All squads will learn many of the same cheers. Specific halftime or mini performances will be taught for sideline cheer as instructed by the coaches and Jr. Coaches at squad practices.

PRACTICE DRESS CODE:

Cheerleaders should come dressed in athletic shorts; cheer shoes w/socks and t-shirt. No skirts, jean shorts, sandals, or hooded sweatshirts please. All hair should be worn off the face, preferably in a ponytail. Please have your cheerleader bring a water bottle with their name on it. We recommend spraying for mosquitoes as well while practicing outdoors.

For safety reasons, no earrings, necklaces, or jewelry of any kind should be worn. Fingernails must be cut short, and no acrylic or fake nails are allowed.

PRACTICES & GAMES SCHEDULES:

All of our cheer squad practices will begin on Tuesday, July 14th, 2020 Summer practices for all squads will be held Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. The summer outdoor practices will take place at the Lake in the Hills Village Hall.

Recreational Squads may reduce practice dates and times, beginning the first week of August (based on individual squad needs), outside at the LITH Village Hall. **When D300 classes start**, the recreational squad practices will decrease to one day a week, indoors, with the location and days and times TBA.

Competition squads will have one indoor practice per week starting in the first week of August at 6:00-8:00pm (day TBD) with the remaining 2 days of practice outdoors at the LITH Village Hall. **When D300 classes start,** all 3 practices will be moved indoors on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays.

Cheer practices do take place rain or shine. It might be raining in one town, but not at our practice site. Always assume there is practice unless other information is received from the organization. In the event of inclement weather that starts during outdoor practices, the cheerleaders will be moved indoors to the LITH Village Hall. Phone calls to parents will be made to make arrangements for pickup.

Please review our Attendance policy for absences and tardiness to practices and football games on Page 8-9 of this handbook.

FOOTBALL GAME/ SIDELINE CHEERING:

Jr. Eagles Football games are every weekend starting the last weekend in August, either on Saturday or Sunday, depending on your squad assignment. There are home games, which are held at Sunset Field, and some traveling to away games during the regular season and playoff games. We are solely dependent on the schedule information that is given to us by The Chicago Youth Football League (TCYFL) in conjunction with the L.A. Jr. Eagles Football Organization.

Game Schedules, as provided to us by the TCYFL football league, will be distributed as follows:

Recreational Squad game schedules are generally given out 1-3 wks. at a time, with the first game's time/location becoming available sometime in late August. The entire game schedule will not be available all at one time. You can expect to have a game every Saturday, with your game occasionally scheduled on a Sunday, occasional travel to away games will be required.

Competition Squad game schedules will also be given out 1-3 weeks at a time. You can expect to have games on either Saturday or Sunday. We plan to cover all of the Sunday football team home games. If they are away we will attempt to cheer at the Saturday team home games, but occasional travel may be required. We will know by mid-August which days you will be cheering when the Sunday teams' schedules come out.

ABSENTEE POLICY:

The organization expects attendance at all practices, games and/or competitions. In order to practice or perform certain cheers and routines, total squad attendance is necessary, especially when executing stunts. It is the responsibility of each cheerleader (and his/her parent) to inform the Squad Parent or Coach if he/she will not be able to attend. If the cheerleader or parent does not notify either party, the absence will be considered *unexcused*. Any cheerleader with an unexcused absence during the two weeks prior to a competition will not be allowed to compete.

<u>Please read and discuss this section with your child so they fully understand L.A. Jr. Golden Eagles Cheerleading expectations and consequences.</u>

Only those cheerleaders who are present for *every* practice and game (incl. playoff and Super bowl) will receive a Perfect Attendance award at the end of the year.

VACATIONS: Any vacations that will take place after the season has started must be submitted in writing to the Director of Cheer for approval prior to the season starting. We require complete squad attendance once games begin in late August. Vacations are not allowed once competition routines are being learned. Special requests must be submitted in writing prior to the season starting. Thank you for your cooperation.

MISSING A PRACTICE: A Squad Parent or Coach must be notified 30 min. prior to the beginning of practice. If this is not done, the absence will automatically be considered unexcused.

*Recreational squad members that miss their 1 scheduled practice per week will not be allowed to perform in the next game's halftime routine.

MISSING A GAME: If you know in advance that you will be missing a game, please notify your Squad Parent or Coach one week prior to that game. This will allow adequate time for the coaches to adjust halftime routines as needed.

TARDINESS:

Tardiness to practice and games negatively impacts your squad. Out of respect for your coaches and teammates, please arrive at practice 10-15 minutes prior to the scheduled start time. Repetitive tardiness to practices or games is unacceptable, and can result in suspension or removal from the cheer squad. In the event that you are 30 minutes late, it will be recorded as an absence.

GAME DAY ILLNESS OR EMERGENCY: Please notify your Squad Parent or Coach 2 hours prior to your cheerleader's expected arrival time if he/she will not be able to attend.

ATTENDANCE POLICY/SUSPENSION: As in any sport, we must limit the number of absences to provide a more beneficial and consistent experience for our cheerleaders. We will enforce and follow these guidelines:

Excused Absences: Any illness, family emergency, school related function (music programs, etc.) or church obligation will be considered an excused absence.

Unexcused Absences: All others. Please refer to the guidelines above for reporting an excused absence. If these are not followed, the absence will be considered unexcused.

If a cheerleader is serving a suspension, he/she must attend the game and sit on the sidelines with their Squad Parent or Coach until their suspension is complete.

Refund Policies:

We understand that circumstances may arise that keep your child from being able to complete the season. However, soon after registration begins, we start the process of ordering personalized items and signing contracts for practice spaces. As a non-profit organization, we are not in the position to absorb these extra costs. We cannot make any exceptions to this policy, including for injury.

Competition Squads:

\$50 gift money will only be returned to the extent that items haven't been purchased. If items have been purchased, you will receive those instead.

\$120 fundraisers fee money will not be reimbursed, however you will still receive the chocolate to sell and recoup your fees.

\$100 competition fees will be reimbursed for any competitions that your cheerleader did not attend. This only applies if notice was given prior to the competition date, and we were refunded the money from the IRCA.

Remaining registration costs of \$325 will be refunded according to this schedule, less a \$50 fee and less any personalized items that have been ordered (i.e. game jersey, bow, etc.):

Prior to June 5th - 100%

June 5^{th} through June $19^{th} - 75\%$

June 20th through July 3rd - 50%

July 4^{th} through July $9^{th} - 25\%$

 $After\ July\ 10^{th}-0\%$

Recreational Squads:

\$25 gift money will only be returned to the extent that items haven't been purchased. If items have been purchased, you will receive those instead.

\$120 fundraisers fee money will not be reimbursed, however you will still receive the chocolate to sell and recoup your fees.

Remaining registration costs of \$225 will be refunded according to this schedule, less a \$25 fee and less any personalized items that have been ordered (i.e. game jersey, bow, etc.):

Prior to June 5th - 100%

June 5^{th} through June $19^{th} - 75\%$

June 20^{th} through July $3^{rd} - 50\%$

July 4^{th} through July $9^{th} - 25\%$

After July $10^{th} - 0\%$

UNIFORMS:

The cheerleading uniform consists of skirt and jersey for games, tank top or long sleeve liner will be needed underneath the jersey, boy shorts, no show socks, cheer shoes, hair bow, and Jr. Eagle's warm-ups. (For cold weather only)

Competition Uniforms consists of a long sleeve body suit, and skirt.

All makeup should be used minimally. No hair, face, or body glitter/paint will be tolerated. Nails should be trimmed and free of polish at all times. No henna allowed. Tattoos are not allowed unless provided by the coach for the squad.

Uniforms are the property of L.A. Jr. Eagles Cheerleading. The game skirt, and the entire competition uniform must be cared for and returned at the end of the season. Sizing is done to the best of our ability, based on current available stock.

Uniforms are not special ordered to fit each cheerleader. Uniforms <u>cannot</u> be altered in any way; which includes marking or removal of tags. Our uniforms are very durable. To keep them looking their best, please wash them routinely. They can be washed in a normal machine cycle. Please turn them inside out and do not wash with any other items. Please hang to air dry....do not machine dry. Thank you for your understanding in this matter. Please contact us at jreaglescheer@yahoo.com if you have any questions.

Please review the "How to care for your uniform" info sheet on our website for printable instructions. Please take care of your uniforms properly during the season.

Uniform Deposit

Recreational and competitive cheerleaders are required to submit a refundable deposit check of \$200.00 at registration. (\$100 for recreational girls). Uniforms will not be issued if you have an outstanding balance, or your uniform deposit check is not received.

The deposit check must be postdated for December 1st, 2020.

One check will be required per cheerleader. Deposit checks will be cashed for any uniforms that have not been returned.

Uniforms will be inspected upon return for any damage. We do understand there will be some normal wear and tear, which will be considered as any stretching at the seams, or button loops, and fading.

Any excessive damage will need to be repaired and you will be charged according to the following schedule.

Missing Rhinestones - \$3 each
Hole in any seam - \$5 per hole
Any food or grease stains – Replacement of uniform piece
Hole not on a seam, which cannot be repaired – Replacement
of uniform piece

If a uniform piece needs to be replaced, you will pay the cost: Bodysuit - \$170 Skirt - \$71

You will be given the damaged uniform, as we will not be able to re-use it.

COACHES AND SQUAD PARENTS:

Whenever possible, each squad will be assigned 1-head coach, 1-2 assistant coaches and 1-2 volunteer Squad Moms or Dads.

Each squad requires at least one coach present at every practice to be CPR/AED certified. Our coaches attend the IRCA Coach Education courses to learn to instruct and teach cheer safely.

Our coaching staff consists of volunteers. While having a cheer background is helpful, it is not necessary. We do require that all coaching applicants enjoy working with children and will take their volunteer responsibility seriously. All coaches will be interviewed prior to being selected to coach and will be required to submit to a background check prior to the season starting.

The Squad Parent's main responsibilities are to support the coaches of their particular squad and to ensure open communication with the cheerleaders and their parents. Duties may include helping coaches spot stunt groups, being at each practice/game, taking practice and game attendance, maintaining emergency contact information, and coordinating all squad activities, including homecoming.

The Squad Mom or Dad for the Competition Squads will also be required to attend competition practices, meetings, competition events, and be in charge of competition activities. If you are interested in volunteering to be a Squad Mom or Dad, please contact VP of Organization at ireaglescheer@yahoo.com.

COACH/SQUAD PARENT ATTENDANCE:

We are extremely grateful for all our volunteers, as we could not do this without you. We understand that there are many responsibilities as parents, however, for the safety of our cheerleaders, we need to have the coach's attendance maximized throughout the season.

Excused vs. Unexcused will not be defined in regards to coaches. The expectation is that as a coach you will attend 80% of practices and games. Parades and extra team-building exercises are not part of this equation.

If at any time during the season, your attendance reaches below 80%, you will be asked to relinquish your duties.

VOLUNTEERS:

Our registration form requires each cheer family a choice of 2 events to volunteer during the season. Please choose which would be a better fit for your schedule. You will be notified of the opportunities to fulfill your volunteer time.

We have been very fortunate in past years to have some incredible support from the families involved and we have every hope that the years to come will be no different. However, with each year that passes, the number of children enrolled in our program grows and therefore, your support becomes more important than ever before.

ANNUAL CHEER SEASON EVENTS:

<u>Parades</u>

Our annual parades are filled with excitement and fun for all that participate. We will walk and perform in the Algonquin Founder's Day Parade in late July and the LITH Sunset Fest Parade in early September. Participation details for our organization will be provided close to the parade date. Attendance is not mandatory, but is highly encouraged.

Parent Showcase

As our full squad outdoor practices come to an end, the organization will host an all squad showcase of cheer skills learned at practices to date. We will also have a raffle for cash prizes and free registration for our cheer families.

Picture Day

Picture Day will be held in mid-August. Information regarding exact time and location will be distributed as soon as it becomes available. Your cheerleader will be photographed with his/her squad and individually, and in our full organization group photo. Order forms are sent home with your child before the scheduled event. We encourage all cheerleaders to attend picture day.

Homecoming Weekend

The L.A. Jr. Eagles cheerleaders will host a Homecoming Weekend. We will help to "Spirit" the L.A. Jr. Eagles football teams to victory and celebrate together with our families. Pregame festivities will be planned and fun is sure to be had by all. We will be asking for 2 volunteers per squad to help run this event. Please speak to your cheerleader's Squad Parent if you are interested in helping. The exact weekend for this event will be announced once the football schedule is finalized.

Competitions

At least four IRCA competitions are scheduled per year for our Competition Squads. Members of the Recreational Squads do not compete. Competitions are held locally, so please show your support by attending these events.

End of Year Banquet and Awards

Each year the Jr. Eagles host our End of the Year banquet. It will be held in December or January. The banquet includes dinner, distribution of participation trophies, and squad awards presentation. The cost for the banquet is included in registration fees for all rec or comp cheerleaders. There will be a cost for family members to attend the banquet. We encourage at least one parent to attend with their cheerleader.

<u>Fundraisers</u>

The organization's board will decide on the fundraisers that we participate in each year to keep the organization successful. A mandatory Fundraising Fee is collected at registration. For the 2020 season, we will be providing 120 World's Finest Chocolate bars, which families can sell to recoup their fee. We also offer a pre-season fundraiser to help offset the cost of our cheer warm up fees.

We have other opportunities to fundraise throughout the season; Car Wash, dinners at local restaurants, Affy Tapples, etc. Our qualifying competition squads will do additional fundraisers to help offset the cost of the IRCA State Competition fees.

Community Service Events

Throughout the cheer season we will participate in 3 Community Service events to give back to our community for their support of our organization. These events have been very successful in past years. We will have 2 food drives and a book drive each season. Dates of these events will be determined each season and parents will be notified of the collection dates for your squad's donations.

MARKETING AND ADVERTISING:

The Director of Fundraising and Marketing is responsible for the advertisement or marketing of the L.A. Jr. Golden Eagles Cheerleaders. Any newsworthy stories or photos should be brought to the attention of the Director of Marketing. The general public does not have the right to advertise or print any media relating to L.A. Jr. Golden Eagles Cheer without the consent of the Executive Board.

You have the right to deny the use of your child's picture or name in any print or advertising media. A release will be part of the registration packet to approve the use of photos or video of your cheerleader for use in organization advertising or social media posts.

The use of mass e-mails obtained through the organization is strictly prohibited. Any email notifications are for the sole use of this organization.

ORGANIZATION SPONSORSHIPS:

COMPETITION SQUADS EXPECTATIONS AND IRCA RULE AGREEMENT:

L.A. Jr. Golden Eagles Cheerleading abides by the rules set forth by the American Recreational Cheer Association (ARCA). The following rule took effect with the 2010 Cheer Season. It states:

Athletes are <u>NOT</u> allowed to participate, practice or perform with an All-Star team during the Recreational Cheer Season. This rule is concurrent with those established with the Illinois High School Association rules.

Any violation of this rule could put an entire cheerleading squad at risk of disqualification. If a cheerleader is found in violation of this rule by the L.A. Jr. Golden Eagles Board of Directors it will result in immediate dismissal from his/her cheerleading squad.

COMPETITION CHEERLEADER EXPECTATIONS:

A competition cheerleading program expectation and agreement form was required to be reviewed and signed by the cheerleader and their parent at registration.

The information provided in that document details the requirements, commitment, and expectations of a Jr. Eagle competitive cheerleader for our season.

IRCA Competition schedules will be available near the end of June each season. Please note the exact dates of our schedule. **ALL scheduled competitions are mandatory.** Missing a cheer competition in lieu of extenuating circumstances (injury, severe illness, or dire family concerns) could cause removal from the competition cheer squad.

CODE OF CONDUCT/ RULE AND ETHICS PLEDGE:

As in any sport, it is important as an organization that we encourage our cheerleaders to demonstrate teamwork, respect and good sportsmanship, both on and off the field and at competitions. We expect each cheerleader and their parents to read, sign, and acknowledge the following important expectations:



I will be courteous and respectful to ALL of my fellow cheerleaders in the Jr. Eagles organization, and all other squads.



I will encourage good sportsmanship from my fellow cheerleaders, Coaches, Jr. Coaches, Squad moms, and parents at every Football game, cheer practice, event, and competition by demonstrating good sportsmanship myself, and with my squad.



I will attend every practice and game that I can and be on time. I understand that if I am unable to attend a practice or game, I will notify my Squad mom, or Coach in advance. Depending on the time of season, I understand that I may be excluded from the next comp or halftime performance for my squad, and the Jr. Eagles Cheer Attendance policies will be enforced.



I will do my best to listen, respect, and learn from my Coaches, Jr. Coaches, and Squad moms at all times.



I will follow all safety rules for stunting/tumbling when my Coaches are present. I will only practice stunting/tumbling when Coaches are present and it is deemed safe to do so.



I will always keep a positive attitude regarding stunting, cheer, and/or position in the routine as assigned on the squad.



I will always treat my Coaches, Jr. Coaches, Squad moms, and all other cheerleaders and fans with respect, regardless of race, sex, creed or abilities, and I will expect to be treated accordingly.





I will use appropriate language and behavior when talking with other cheerleaders, Coaches, Jr. Coaches, Squad moms, parents, fans, other squads, and their staff. Inappropriate behavior & unsportsmanlike conduct is not allowed & will be addressed.

I will NOT bully, bash, or use any negative comments in ANY text messages, e-mails, Instagram, Facebook, Twitter, Snap Chat, or ANY other social websites as they apply to Jr. Eagles staff, cheerleaders, and ANY other individuals while I am a Jr. Eagles Cheerleader. This behavior will/can result in possible dismissal from my squad.



Any negative behavior, in any regard, brought to the attention of the Jr. Eagles Cheer organization while an active member will/can possibly jeopardize my participation as a cheerleader if deemed inappropriate and/or intolerable behavior or actions by the Jr. Eagles Cheer board/coaches. This will be addressed by the board and coaches immediately.



I will do my very best in school and remember that good grades are important while I am participating in cheerleading.



I will encourage my parents to be involved with my squad in some capacity because it is important to me.



I will use only approved cheers and chants, and remember that I represent L.A. Jr. Golden Eagles Cheerleading at all events.

Disciplinary Action:

Disciplinary action will be decided on a per occurrence basis as determined by the Board of Directors for any cheerleader, Coach, Squad parent, Jr. Coach, or board member who does not follow their designated L.A. Jr. Eagles Cheerleading Code of Conduct/Ethics Pledge, or exhibits behavior that is unbecoming or derogatory to the image of the Jr. Eagles Cheer organization.
